What is a Solemn Assembly? At our annual meeting this fall we used the words Solemn Assembly several times to announce/promote those churches who have called for their congregations to have a time of intentional prayer for God's favor to fall on His churches in our area Many people might not be aware of what this term entails, so I thought I would share a little background. The solemn assembly comes from the practice of Israel in the Old Testament. It was a time when the whole community gathered for a special worship occasion; often they were called during a time of crisis or a critical moment in the life of the people Joel 2 presents a clear example of a solemn assembly called for the purpose of seeking God's help.

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, "Where is their God?""

Joel 2:12-17

The solemn assembly is called when we the church become aware of our dire need and that without God's mercy we will perish. When we find that we have been going through the motions of worship and the culture around us is crumbling partly because we have failed to be a light in the darkness, that is when we need to cry out to God and rend our hearts, not just tear our garments. The people of God set aside their ordinary schedules in order to have an intentional time of extraordinary prayer and submission to the Word of God. Everyone in the church is called to an inter-generational assembly. The time is set aside as sanctified unto the Lord.

Now you know. Maybe the Lord will call you to declare a solemn assembly where you are as we seek to keep making disciple-making disciples and see South Mississippi become known for the name of Jesus Christ, Bro. T
